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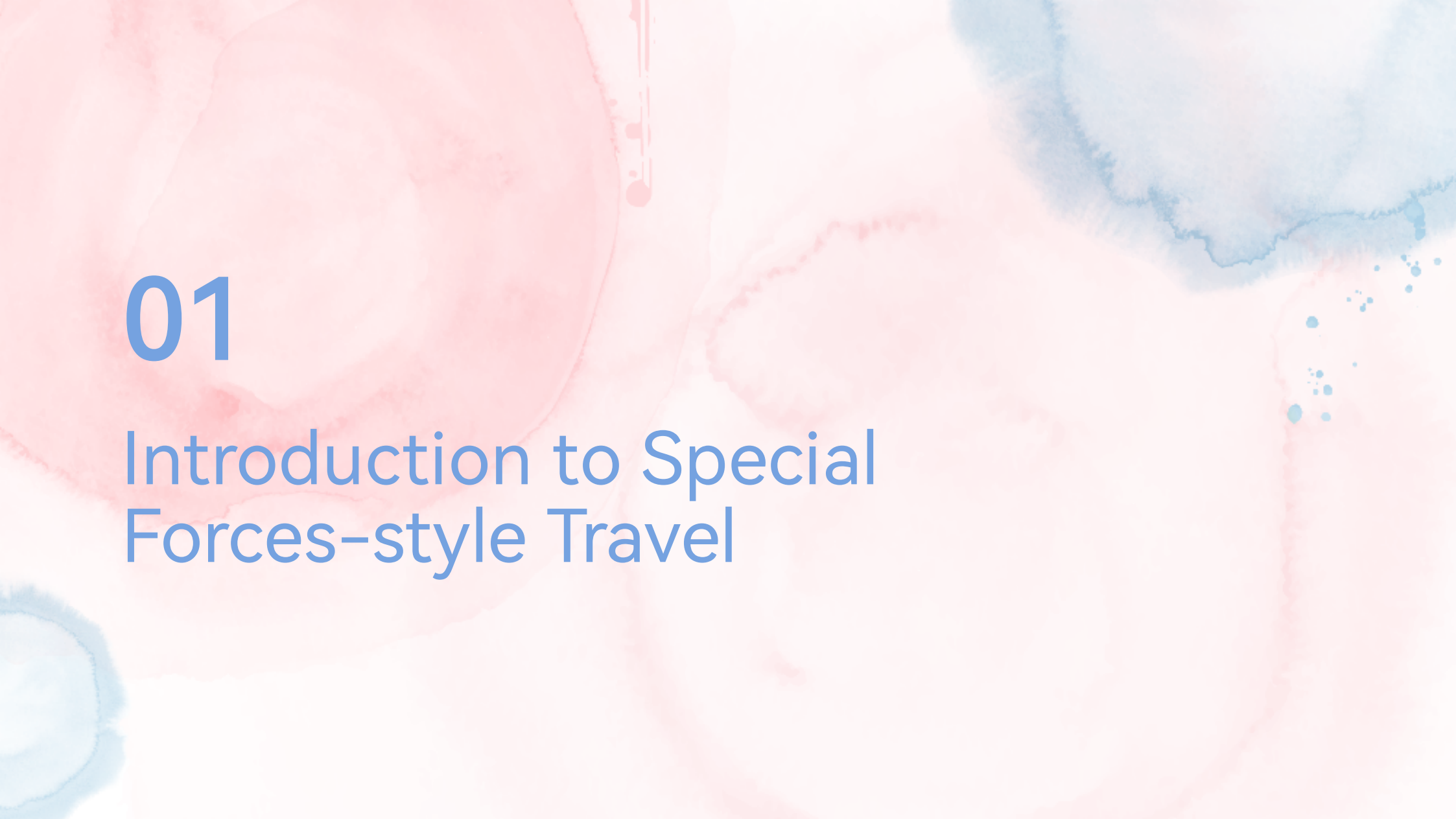
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Introduction to Special Forces-style Travel

Explore countries like Thailand, Vietnam, and Cambodia with a tight budget, using local transportation and staying in hostels.



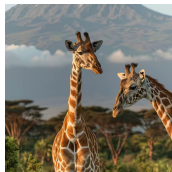
Cultural Immersion in Europe
